Public Comment

Hiu Ng, parent, indicated that he spoke with someone from Ardenwood at the end of last school year who was concerned that they were using a Windows95 computer. Mr. Ng found out recently that previous CTO has left FUSD. He wants to comment and raise the issue of this to make sure that it hasn't been forgotten. Toni indicated that it is currently being addressed and the site has a new administrator that is on board and ensuring that this issue is being addressed.

Mr. Ng also spoke regarding concerns about Student Information System. There is some confusion regarding where student performance data is recorded. Rob explained it by giving an example of student data imported into SIS but it is a different conversation. TAC will bring this back at another meeting because it is off topic.

CTO Update:

Joe reported out regarding poor state of network infrastructure. Old cabling and switching cannot fully support wireless and other network devices connecting to it.  
Joe also gave an update regarding SIS Project. Technology Department will be going before the board for consideration and hopefully approval. FUSD will then be able to begin moving forward with the project. Joe also gave an update on computer standards and how FUSD might fund these purchases on an annual basis.

200 Wireless Access Points (WAPs) have been installed since last year.
